

Greetings Members,

The summer holiday season is finally here, and that means the Centre is a little slower . . . with many visiting family, working in the yard, and enjoying other summer activities. For the staff at Nord-Bridge, we too have been taking some breaks. After June's Senior's Week, and the Nord-Bridge Father's Day event - - which I thank all members and political leaders for supporting - - Janay and I took a week plus off, and made a trip with four other couples to southern Utah, eastern Colorado, and northern Arizona to motorcycle the National Parks and sites of the Grand Canyon area. Our bikes were trailered to the starting point. We then visited: Bryce Canyon; the Grand Staircase, the Mesa Verda (aboriginal) cliff dwellings; Monument Valley and the Navajo



Tougher penalties for drunk driving coming to Alberta on July 1 (from Lethbridge Sun times June 27, 2012)

The Alberta government is bringing in its tougher new penalties for drinking and driving on the July 1 long weekend. Transportation Minister Ric McIver says the amount of booze a driver can consume before getting behind the wheel hasn't changed, but the consequences have. Drivers caught with a blood alcohol level higher than .08 will lose their license immediately and not be allowed behind the wheel until charges are resolved.

Alberta is the first province to institute indefinite suspensions for being caught after too many drinks. Drivers convicted under federal laws also will have a device installed in their vehicles for up to five years to prevent them from starting (their car) if high blood alcohol is detected. McIver says he's confident the legislation has enough safeguards and avenues for appeal to survive a constitutional challenge.








FOOD AND DRUG INTERACTIONS

People combine foods all the time but do not consider the consequences of drug interactions with food and beverages. These interactions may include delayed, decreased, or enhanced absorption of a medication.

- Dairy products interfere with the absorption of many drugs such as certain antibiotics and should, therefore, be taken at a different time of day.
- Grapefruit or grapefruit juice affects the metabolism of certain drugs such as cholesterol medication (i.e. Lipitor) and some blood pressure medications and should be avoided at all

times.



- Alcohol can increase side effects of certain drugs (i.e. sleeping pills) or reduce the effectiveness of other drugs (i.e. stimulants).
- Licorice interacts specifically with Digoxin causing higher than normal blood levels.
- Caffeinated beverages reduce the effectiveness of sleeping pills.
- ▼ Green leafy vegetables can reduce the effectiveness of Warfarin.

Some medications should be taken with food, while others on an empty stomach. Your pharmacist can provide you with the information you need to receive the best benefits from your medications.



LOCAL MINING IN THE 1950's

In 1957 Mike Stefancsik worked at the Murray Mine at East Coulee near Drumheller. At the time the mine had a three foot seam of coal. It was Mike's job to pick out the coal floor sufficient to run track and mine cars into the seam.

In 1958 Mike was working at the Crown Mine at East Coulee. This mine had a large coal seam and the mine shaft was supported by approximately eight foot

support beams. According to Mike "coal was on both the top and bottom. Sometimes they had about 27 feet without a timber. It was sure nice to work in."



Lights in the coulee on

three different levels (run between 4:30 and 6:00 p.m.) were used as a signal to the miners as to which mine would be working the next day. If the light designated for your shift came on, then you knew to go to work the next day; otherwise, you stayed home!

This past April, Mike & Edith Stefancsik made an interesting donation to our miner's artefact collection which is located inside our main entrance. The Stefancsik's donation includes three items: a carbide holder (grey container with a sliding lid); a brass carbide lamp; and a galvanized water canteen.

According to Mike, the carbide holder contained small carbide rocks about the size of a marble. These carbide rocks were placed in the holder portion of the lamp. The top section of the lamp held water which would drip down onto the carbide and create a gas



reaction. The volume of the gas would depend upon the amount of water that was dripping down the tube onto the carbide. The volume of gas would correlate to the brightness of the light. The lamp was then placed on the helmet.

We extend sincere thanks to Mike and Edith and to all those who have so generously contributed to our miner's collection.
